

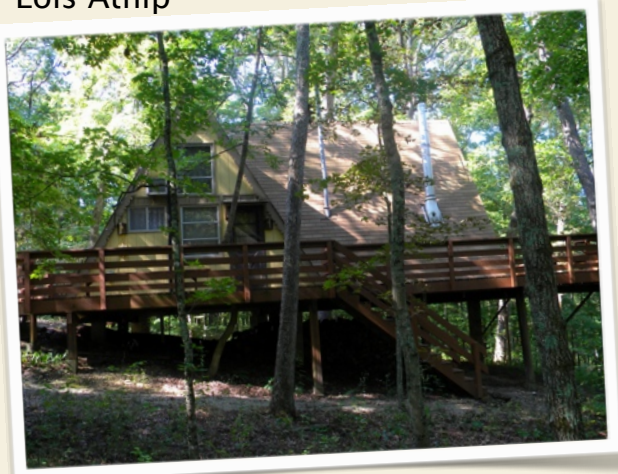
# Cabin 118

Cabin 114 is just 4 years old, built new except the A from the original cabin. Many nice features include a furnace, central air, deep well, wood floors on main level and carpet upstairs. The upstairs has 2 separate bedrooms, each with french doors. There is also a sleeping area and a half-bath. The main level is inviting with 2 walls of full glass windows overlooking the deck and beautiful woods. The large, well designed bath has a nice shower and sink. Lots of windows in the breakfast area, where you can watch the wildlife while having your morning coffee. The kitchen is very well equipped with lots of cabinets, refrigerator and range. This chalet comes completely furnished, all you need to bring are your clothes and food. There are 2 large decks for entertaining and grilling your steaks. Sun Valley Lake is a short stroll away.

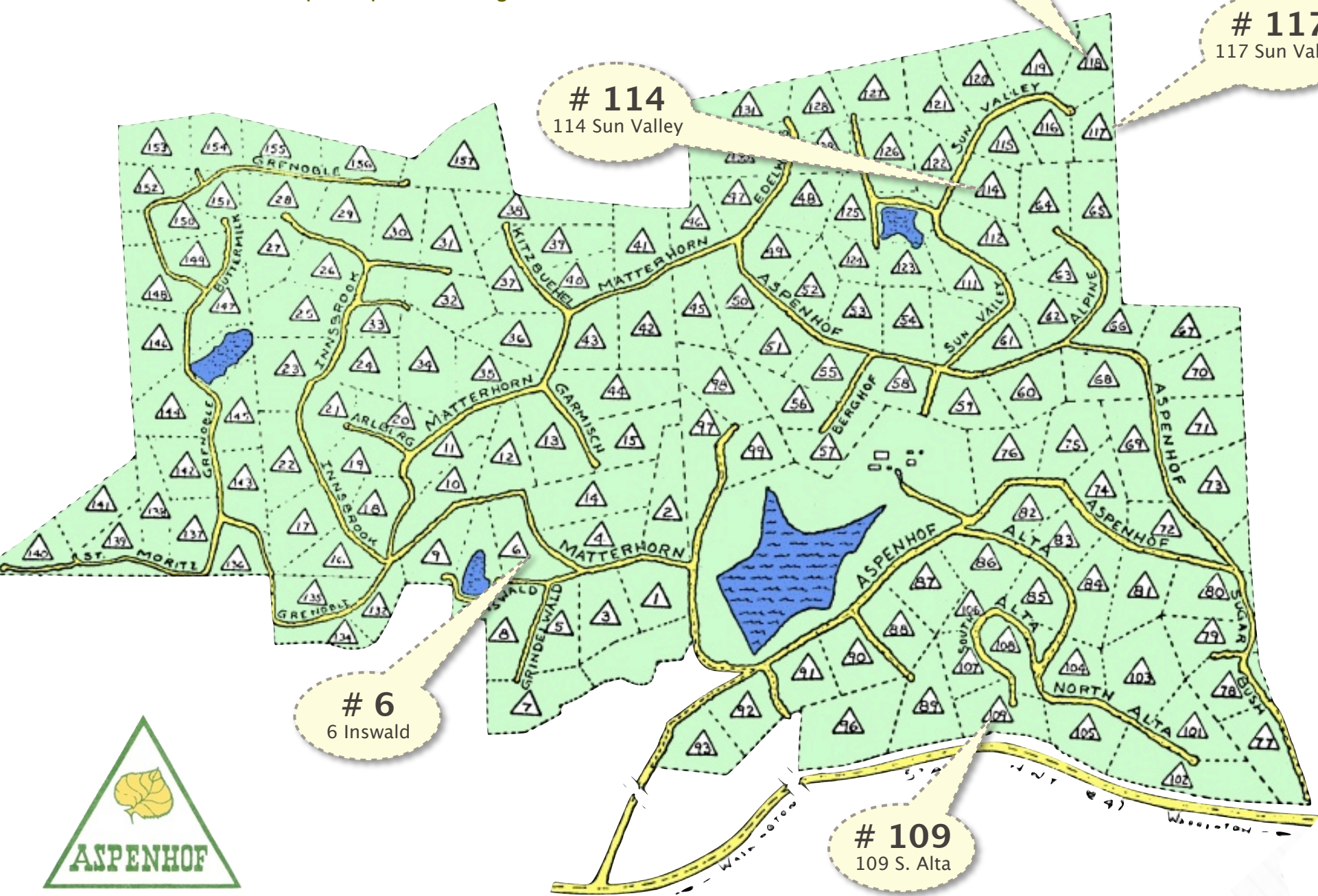
